The DEOS FVEY enclave is provisioned within the separately accredited Microsoft Azure Impact Level 6 (IL6) environment. DEOS FVEY hosts common services and capabilities that support the separately authorized DoD365-SEC REL FVEY and DoD365-SEC REL FVEY IaaS systems. The deployment consists of Azure Virtual Desktop Privileged Access Workstation (AVD PAW), Assured Compliance Assessment Solution (ACAS), Microsoft Sentinel (monitoring), Azure Lighthouse and Log Analytics (logging). DEOS FVEY is monitored by DISA CSSP and DEOS Cyber Tier III. The enclave is limited to privileged user access only for administration and management of the DoD365-SEC REL FVEY tenants, users and support infrastructure. The types of personal information that is collected includes: Name(s), Official Duty Telephone Phone Number, DoD ID Number, Position/Title, and Work Email Address.
